



# The Neuroblastoma Society

The Society's sole purpose is the relief of children suffering from neuroblastoma and to achieve this it raises funds for British medical research into improving both diagnosis and treatment of the disease. The Society also offers an opportunity for parents to give each other mutual help, support and comfort.

The Society is administered by Lay and Medical Trustees, who meet regularly to deal with its business, and oversee the Trust. The whole organisation is run by voluntary effort, and the Trustees welcome help with administration from members.

The Society has an informal befriending scheme to give support, usually by telephone, to parents and other close family members of a child with neuroblastoma. The scheme links enquirers with members who have volunteered to share their experiences, and all stages of the disease are represented. It is in addition to, and not a substitute for, professional advice and support offered from the treatment centre.
